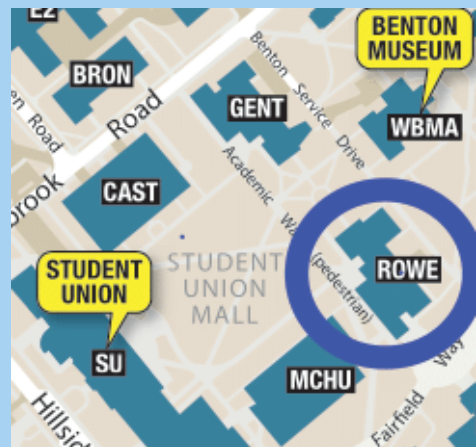

2023 CYCLE APPLICANT CORNER

NOTE: If you are still waiting for your letter packet to be submitted and you're not sure why it hasn't been submitted yet, please contact our team (premed_predental@uconn.edu).

The Health Professions Letter Packet (HPLP) application for the 2023 Cycle will close in one month on **Saturday, October 1st**.

Anyone applying to medical or dental school for matriculation in the fall of 2023 that wants to receive a letter packet from our office must submit their HPLP by 10/1. **If you fail to meet this deadline, we will NOT submit a letter packet on your behalf.**

Both folks that met with us for an applicant coaching session and have a drafted cover letter and folks that did not meet with us are welcome to receive a letter packet.

Q: What if I've decided to defer my application?

A: If you have met with our office for an applicant coaching session and have decided to defer your application until a later cycle, please email us so that we can update our records.

Q: What happens when I defer or when this HPLP closes?

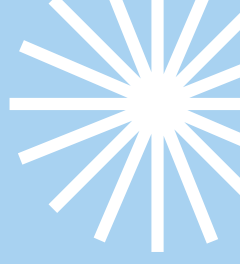

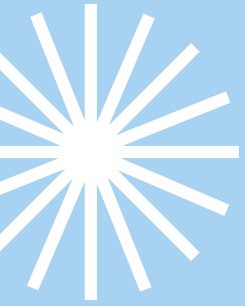

Looking to gain hands-on clinical experience but aren't certified as a EMT or CNA? We may have the opportunity for you! The Mobility Volunteer Program at Hartford Hospital is currently looking for volunteers.

This program provides support to patients that need assistance and encouragement to get out of bed and walk to help maintain functional status. Overseen by the Department of Rehabilitation, volunteers are trained to function in this role on assigned nursing units, interacting directly with patients and staff.

Applicants must:

- Be able to volunteer **at least one 3-hour-shift per week in the MORNING or AFTERNOON** (there are no evening shifts)
- Be able to attend the training on **Thursday, September 22nd from 6:00-8:30PM**
- Be available to train with another experienced volunteer on a weekday for two (2) shifts prior to volunteering independently
- Complete all hospital requirements online (background check, orientation, HIPAA education, COVID education module and waiver, medical history form including MMR, varicella and COVID vaccines, and TB skin or blood test no more than 12 mo old) no later than **Sept 20th**
- Have a flu vaccine in October

The Bae Lab at UConn Health (Farmington, CT) is seeking a part-time research assistant to help with research projects related to human neuro-developmental disorders (e.g. microcephaly, autism).

Example duties include preparing cell + animal tissues samples and reagents, as well as biochemical, cellular, and animal behavioral analysis. **Minimum qualifications** include a bachelor's degree in Biology, Neuroscience, Psychology, or Biochemistry. **Preferred qualifications** include experience with handling mice as well as basic lab skills (such as cell culture). 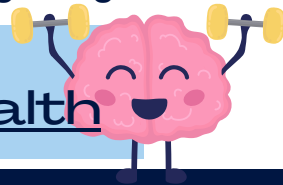
HEAR FROM DR. SIBU SAHA!

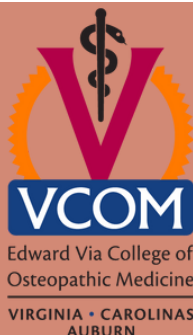

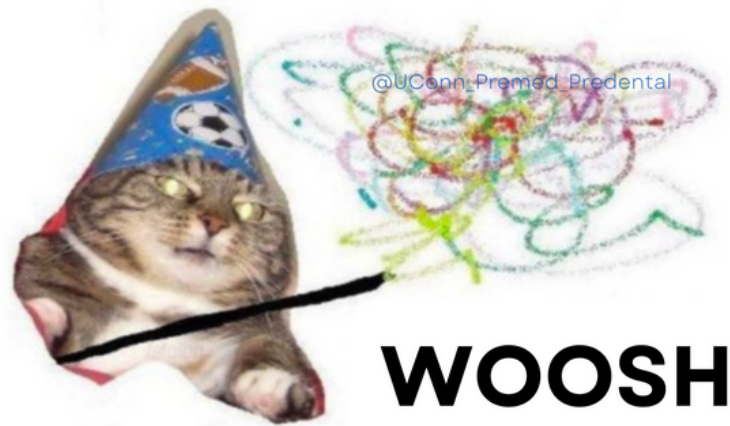
